## ABOUT THE COLLEGE

Sri Guru Tegh Bahadur Khalsa College, established in 1951, is a prestigious institution under the University of Delhi, managed by the Delhi Sikh Gurdwara Management Committee. Initially founded to provide education to Punjabi refugees post-partition, the college began in Dev Nagar, New Delhi, and moved to its current campus in University Enclave in 1971. The campus was inaugurated by Smt. Indira Gandhi in 1973. Rooted in the legacy of Sri Guru Tegh Bahadur Sahib, the college's value system is defined by secularism, human rights, and the *mar-jeevda* ideal of fearless, principled living.

The college offers 19 undergraduate and 14 postgraduate programs across Humanities, Commerce, and Sciences. It has evolved significantly, with the introduction of postgraduate courses and various certificate programs in foreign and Indian languages. The college also provides undergraduate and postgraduate diplomas, including a unique Postgraduate Diploma in Forensic Science. In alignment with the National Education Policy 2020, the college offers flexible subject combinations, Skill Enhancement Courses and Value Addition Courses (SEC and VAC). Presently, we have on the rolls 2670 students.

Academic excellence is supported by state-of-the-art laboratories in Zoology, Botany, Chemistry, Physics, Electronics, and Computer Science, along with a botanical garden for research. The Mata Gujri Library, with over 1,45,300 books, digital resources, and access to national and international journals, supports scholarly pursuits. The Guru Angad Dev Malaviya Mission Teacher Training Centre offers various faculty development programs and MOOCs.

The college also boasts a national-level sports complex and hosts annual tournaments, such as the Sahibzada Zorawar Singh & Sahibzada Fateh Singh T-20 Cricket Tournament and the Baba Deep Singh Hockey & Basketball Tournaments (both men's and women's, with floodlight facilities). These events attract state, national, and international-level players. The Sports quota admissions in our college are available in the following 9 games: Cricket, Hockey, Handball, Basketball, Baseball, Volleyball, Athletics, Tennis, and Badminton. Other in-college sports events, including 'Khelutsav,' Yoga Day, and various year-round tournaments, further enrich the sports culture.

The on-campus girls' hostel, with 147 beds and modern amenities, provides a comfortable living environment for students. The Master Tara Singh Auditorium, a hub for cultural and academic events, hosts over fifteen academic societies, ten co-curricular societies, and thirteen arts and cultural societies, including the vibrant annual "Lashkara" festival, which celebrates the college's rich cultural life. The college adheres to University of Delhi regulations and promotes a dynamic academic atmosphere.

The UGC-Malaviya Mission Teacher Training Centre (UGC-MMTTC) at SGTB Khalsa College, University of Delhi, is a premier national centre under the Ministry of Education, recognized for its outstanding contribution to teacher training and its leadership in implementing NEP-2020, having conducted over 50 events in 2024-25, benefitting 8,329 participants nationwide.



During this academic session, the college saw 55 teaching faculty promotions and one non-teaching promotion. Academic distinction was marked by five major externally funded research projects—supported by UGC, ANRF, DRDO, and the University of Delhi—totalling ₹1.54 crore, along with patents awarded to the Departments of Computer Science and Zoology. Faculty contributions included numerous publications in reputed national and international journals, books, and edited volumes. Across departments, faculty members presented papers, served as resource persons, keynote speakers, and were recognized as executive members, subject experts, and research supervisors on prominent academic platforms. Several faculty members of the college have received prestigious recognitions and appointments at national and international levels for their outstanding contributions in their respective fields, showcasing the institution's commitment to academic excellence, leadership, and cultural promotion. During the academic session, 17 Academic Societies and 39 ECA Societies were actively coordinated by the faculty, fostering a vibrant co-curricular environment. The college hosted a series of distinguished lectures, seminars, conferences, and workshops, graced by eminent speakers and guests, enriching the academic discourse.

The institution's strong commitment to social responsibility was reflected in a wide range of outreach initiatives conducted under the Viksit Bharat Programme, NSS, NCC, the Viksit Bharat Ambassador Club, and the Connecting Dreams Foundation Society. Notably, the UGC-MMTTC conducted 610 programmes, engaging 1,15,501 participants, and ranked first among 144 centres nationwide in both the number of programmes conducted and total beneficiaries reached.

The college secured top positions in Inter-College Competitions 2024 organized by the Delhi University Sports Council and other open tournaments. Highlights include 4 gold medals in athletics, standout performances in badminton at national and international levels, and basketball representation at the North Zone and Khelo India National Games. Notable achievements were also recorded in cricket, handball, and judo. The successful conduct of the 11th Sahibzada Zorawar Singh and Sahibzada Fateh Singh Floodlight T20 Tournament reaffirmed the college's strong commitment to promoting sportsmanship.

The unwavering contributions of 138 dedicated faculty members and 111 committed non-teaching staff reflect the institution's enduring pursuit of academic excellence, cultural vitality, and intellectual growth.

## **MATA GUJRI LIBRARY**

The College Library is a well-stocked facility with a collection of more than 1,45,300 books and titles across various disciplines, along with 7 Indian journals, 28 magazines, and 27 newspapers. It holds institutional membership with the UGC-NLIST program. It is connected to the Delhi University wide-area campus networking system and provides users access to electronic resources through the Delhi University Library System (DULS) and the UGC-INFONET Consortium. Students automatically become members of the library upon admission to the College. It maintains an excellent collection of textbooks, general books, and reference materials to support the academic requirements of both students and faculty members. It caters



to the needs of undergraduate and postgraduate students, supporting their research and learning activities. The services are fully automated. The annual general budget allocated for books was ₹13,65,000 (Rupees Thirteen Lakh Sixty-Five Thousand only) this year. The library also houses a separate section with 8,000 classics and reference books on Sikh studies. Additionally, approximately 2,000 books across various subjects are added to the collection each year.

The library is fully computerized, with all books bar-coded and easily accessible through the Online Public Access Catalogue (OPAC). A gate security system and 32 CCTV cameras ensure constant monitoring. It also preserves all editions of the college magazine *The Tegh*, with the first edition published in 1953. The three-floor library houses the circulation counter, OPAC, processing section, and stacks on the ground floor; textbooks, reference books, periodicals, and a teachers' reading room on the first floor; and a 200-seat reading hall with an LCD projector for orientation and training on the second floor. A separate room has been allotted on the ground floor of the library for PWD students. The library has subscription to LEX software from University of Delhi which allows PWD students to convert e-books to PDF and download them to be used as study material.

#### Workshops and Training Programmes

- Library Orientation: Conducted at the start of each academic session to familiarize students with the library's resources and services.
- N-LIST Training: Held twice weekly to train students in using e-resources and gather feedback.
- Internship Programme: Library Science students undergo one-month training across all library sections.
- New Arrivals: Lists of newly added books are periodically displayed in the reading hall.
- Question Bank and Syllabus: Previous years' question papers and syllabi are available for reference and photocopying.

#### New Initiatives

- Library is in the process of becoming fully air-conditioned.
- A dedicated library web page will be launched soon.

### SRI GURU HAR RAI BOTANICAL GARDEN

The Guru Har Rai Botanical Garden of the college is flourishing with a variety of plant species. Some of the important medicinal plants growing in the garden include Ashwagandha, Kala Bansa, Neem, Aloe vera, Patthar chatta, Shatavari, varieties of Tulasi etc. To add more varieties of Tulasi to the garden, the event “**Ek Kadam Arogyata ki ore**” was organized by Department of Botany which was followed by planting the nursery beds in the garden with **Tulasi varieties** like shyama Tulasi and long Tulasi by Principal Sir, Guest speakers and Faculty members on 10.09.2025. In collaboration with NSS, SGTB Khalsa College, a project on **Compost making** is currently going on in the botanical garden. The flora of garden is added up by plant species *Crotalaria juncea* (Sun Hemp), Cotton, *Cajanus cajan* (Arhar) and other species required for botanical practical such as Coriander, Spinach, Fenugreek, Fennel, Salvia, Wheat etc. The rockery of the garden was maintained and participated in the “**Annual Flower Show**” of University of Delhi, 2025. A team of 75 students of B.A.M.S second year from **Shree Saptashrungi Ayurved Mahavidyalaya & Hospital, Nashik** enthusiastically visited the Botanical Garden in March, 2025 along with 3 faculty members to study medicinal plants growing in the garden.



## UGC-MALAVIYA MISSION TEACHER TRAINING CENTRE

The **UGC-MMTTC/GAD-MMTTC** at Sri Guru Tegh Bahadur Khalsa College, University of Delhi, is a UGC and Ministry of Education initiative. Formerly the Guru Angad Dev Teaching Learning Centre (GAD-TLC), it has pioneered faculty training since 2016. Selected to lead NEP 2020 training under the **Malaviya Mission-Teacher Training Programme (MMTTP)**, it is one of only four centres awarded MMTTC status from 45,000 colleges nationwide.

**Vision:** *To enhance faculty competencies in teaching, research, and Indian values while aligning with NEP 2020.*

Ranked **first among 144 centres**, UGC-MMTTC has conducted the most programmes with the highest number of beneficiaries. At the **MMTTP Northern Zone Regional Workshop** (March 2025), Prof. Vimal Rarh shared best practices for **NEP Orientation**.

The Centre offers **online and offline programmes** for **CAS promotion**, including **NEP Orientation, Faculty Induction, Refresher Courses, and Faculty Development Programmes**. It also conducts **training for non-teaching staff** and collaborates with other institutions. Some programmes are fully or partially UGC-sponsored.

### Collaborations of UGC-MMTTC (GAD-MMTTC) – 2024-25

In the year 2024–25, UGC-MMTTC (GAD-MMTTC) conducted 50 events (online, offline, and hybrid modes) attended by 8,329 participants across the country, in collaboration with various national and international institutions.

**International Collaboration** - UGC-MMTTC has partnered with NPTC Group of Colleges, United Kingdom.

**National Collaborations** - In India, UGC-MMTTC collaborated with 7 institutions in Delhi, 5 in Maharashtra, 2 in Uttar Pradesh, and 1 each in Tamil Nadu, Kerala, Rajasthan, Assam, Madhya Pradesh, Andhra Pradesh, Karnataka, Haryana, and Bihar.

## ACADEMIC RESULTS

The examination results have been overwhelmingly satisfactory across all three academic years, with a significant percentage of students securing high scores and first-division rankings. The detailed analysis is as follows:

**Third Year:** Out of 1,067 students who appeared for the examinations, 599 students secured 7.5 CGPA (75%) and above, while 304 students scored 6.0 CGPA (60%) and above. This indicates a strong academic performance among third-year students, with a high percentage achieving distinction.

**Second Year:** A total of 789 students appeared for the examinations. Among them, 252 students achieved 7.5 CGPA (75%) and above, while 315 students secured 6.0 CGPA (60%) and above. The results show consistent academic performance in the second year.

**First Year:** In the first-year examinations, 925 students appeared. 258 students secured 7.5 CGPA (75%) and above, while 339 students obtained 6.0 CGPA (60%) and above. The results highlight a promising start for first-year students.

#### **Gender Sensitisation Sessions (10-20 September, 2024)**

The members of the ICC explained what constitutes sexual harassment under the law. Over 500 students attended these sessions, which were designed to foster a respectful and inclusive environment by raising awareness of gender roles, equality, and the need to challenge stereotypes. The presentation outlined the procedures for filing complaints, the legal frameworks such as the POSH Act and UGC Guidelines, and the steps taken by the ICC to ensure impartial redressal. It also debunked common myths surrounding sexual harassment, emphasized the seriousness of the issue, and detailed the potential consequences for those found guilty of misconduct.

#### **Training session of Internal Complaints Committee members (23 October, 2024)**

A training session for ICC members was conducted by Ms. Rupinder Kaur, the External Member of ICC. She emphasized strategies to improve the ICC's effectiveness and addressed key issues related to workplace sexual harassment. Ms. Kaur highlighted the importance of recognizing inappropriate behaviour, understanding the reporting process, and ensuring fair investigations. She stressed the need for written complaints and responses to promote clarity, confidentiality, and transparency in the resolution process. Additionally, it was suggested that the list of ICC members with contact details be posted on the college website and notice boards to enhance accessibility and trust.

#### **Period Pain Simulation Event (06<sup>th</sup> March 2025)**

The Internal Complaints Committee (ICC) and Women Development Cell (WDC) of SGTB Khalsa College, in collaboration with Womenite NGO, organized a **Period Pain Simulation** event to promote menstrual health awareness and gender sensitivity. The initiative aimed to challenge societal taboos and foster empathy among participants. The event educated students, especially men, about menstrual pain through a **simulation device** that mimicked period cramps. Participants voluntarily experienced the discomfort, leading to increased awareness and empathy. Many expressed surprise at the intensity of the pain, fostering meaningful conversations on menstrual health and breaking societal stereotypes. The event saw active participation, with attendees pledging to support menstrual awareness initiatives. It successfully fostered inclusivity and understanding, making it a significant step toward gender equality.

#### **Poster Making Competition and Slogan writing Competition (3<sup>rd</sup> April 2025)**

### **Qafila'24**

Acrostic successfully organized its annual flagship event, Qafila '24, on 12th and 13th November. The event hosted three inter-college poetry competitions: Hiraeth, an English poetry slam; Sunehe, a Punjabi poetry slam; and Shabdostav, a Hindi/Urdu poetry slam. The themes of these competitions did not restrict the participants creatively, allowing the participants to explore different styles and genres of poetry. Some of the notable honours have been the following awards won by the Society across a range of cultural and media festivals:

Our in-house production *Dichotomy* received multiple accolades, including 1st positions at Netaji Subhas University of Technology and Ramanujan College, Best Cinematography at Vivekananda Institute of Professional Studies, and special mentions at Delhi Technological University and College of Vocational Studies. Our in-house production *Bhola-sa-Mann* secured 1st positions at Shaheed Bhagat Singh College, Maharaja Agrasen College, and Shri Ram College of Commerce, and was officially selected for the Nivart Film Festival in New Delhi and a screening at St. Mary's College, Hyderabad.

### **Society Activities:**

The event featured a hybrid format with both physical and virtual participation, and hosted **10 committees**, including UNGA-DISEC, UNCSW, AIPPM, International Press, and virtual committees such as UNHRC and UNEP. A significant highlight of this year’s conference was the collaboration with esteemed organizations such as **WWF (World Wide Fund for Nature)**, **CYPAN (Commonwealth Youth Peace Ambassadors Network)**, **the Commonwealth Nations**, and **NSDC (National Skill Development Corporation)**.

These partnerships elevated the conference’s stature and outreach. More than **30 awards** were presented to outstanding delegates who showcased exceptional diplomacy, negotiation skills, and political insight.



## **Debate and Discussion Society**

## **Aavriti: The Electronics Department Society**

**Educational trip to National Physical Laboratory:** Department of Electronics arranged an educational visit for the students to National Physical Laboratory (NPL), New Delhi on 1st October 2024. There the students were educated about cryogenics (liquid nitrogen and helium plants) used to maintain extremely low temperatures in experimental setups. They also got the chance to visit a fluid flow calibration laboratory where they learned how flow meters are calibrated. In the Carbon division of NPL, students saw different products made up of carbon fibres and a polymer matrix, used in applications requiring high strength and low weight. Students were also educated about different types of solar cells in the Photovoltaic labs of NPL. They saw sophisticated systems used to dope Si and prepare thin film solar cell structures. At the end, the students were educated about the Scanning Electron Microscope used to study nano structures.

**Seminar on Digital Signal Processing:** A seminar on "Applications of Digital Signal Processing in manipulating Audio Signals" was organized in the department on 1 Feb 2025. It was conducted by one of our alumni, Mr. Tarun Thakur, currently working in the software industry. The students were made aware of the various methods by which audio signals can be manipulated using Discrete Fourier Transform algorithms. Students found it very informative and requested the presenter to conduct more sessions on other applications of Digital Signal Processing.

## **Comsoc - The Commerce Department Society**

### **Student Council Elections**

### **Curieux’25 – A Day of Tech, Logic, and Strategy**

On 5th April 2025, Curieux organized Curieux’25 as part of the college’s annual cultural fest, *Lashkara’25*. The event attracted participation from students across institutions, offering a platform for collaborative learning and competitive coding.

Two main events were conducted:

#### **1. Bug Bingo**

A high-speed debugging competition where participants identified and fixed bugs in syntactically and logically flawed code snippets.

- *Prelims*: A rapid 3-minute 20-second round filtered top performers.
- *Final Round*: A 1-hour coding challenge emphasized code optimization.
- *Outcome*: Participants demonstrated deep algorithmic understanding and coding efficiency under pressure.

#### **2. Code Relay Auction**

An innovative coding + bidding event that merged logic with strategy.

- *Mechanism*: Teams bid on questions categorized into difficulty levels.
- *Scoring*: Points were awarded based on correctness and speed; incorrect answers drew penalties.
- *Twist*: Tie bids led to relay-style coding faceoffs.
- *Impact*: This event tested both coding skills and tactical thinking, standing out for its unique format.



## AI Tic-Tac-Toe Challenge Stall

An interactive AI-based stall also featured at the event, drawing crowds throughout the day.

- *Concept:* Participants played against an unbeatable AI using the Minimax algorithm with Alpha-Beta pruning.
- *Tech Stack:* Backend in Python, frontend using JavaScript and HTML.
- *Challenge:* Most games ended in a draw; few beat the AI and won prizes.
- *Educational Element:* Volunteers explained the AI logic, turning the stall into a micro-learning station on game theory and decision trees.

## Impact & Participation

The events were open and free for all, encouraging maximum participation and inclusivity. With over ₹10,000 in prizes and certificates for winners and runners-up, the competition fostered enthusiasm and recognition. Tiebreakers emphasized code efficiency, highlighting the importance of real-world software development practices.

### **Orientation program (19 September 2024)**

An orientation program for the first year B.Sc. Physics students was organized by the Physics society. It began with a warm welcome of newcomers. An introductory session led by faculty members, outlining the curriculum structure, grading systems, and essential resources. The program highlighted the importance of physics in understanding fundamental natural laws and how the course would foster analytical and problem-solving skills. Students were also introduced to the wide range of lab equipment available for hands-on learning. Students were also introduced to research opportunities and student societies, encouraging active engagement in scientific pursuits beyond the classroom. The orientation concluded with a Q&A session and refreshments.

### **CSIR-NPL Visit (1st October 2024)**

On its Open Day, B.Sc. Physics students of the SGTB Khalsa college visited the CSIR-National Physical Laboratory (NPL), gaining a unique insight into scientific research. This educational visit allowed students to explore various scientific advancements and witness the practical applications of physics in a real-world setting. Students participated in guided tours of various laboratories, witnessing cutting-edge research in fields such as metrology, nanotechnology, and material science. Students observed advanced laboratory equipment, such as high voltage and current labs, radio wave demonstrations and atomic clocks, deepening their understanding of high-precision measurement technologies crucial for scientific and industrial progress. The visit concluded with a Q&A session, where students engaged directly with scientists, clarifying doubts and exploring future career pathways in research. This Open Day experience was highly inspiring, expanding students' perspectives on the impact of physics and scientific research.



## Exploring the world inside an Atom

On November 7, 2024, the Department of Physics at Sri Guru Tegh Bahadur Khalsa College hosted an enlightening talk titled *Exploring the World Inside an Atom*. The event took place in Physics Lab 2, at 11:30 AM and was attended by 23 students and 5 faculty members. The speaker for the session was **Dr. Mohammad Naimuddin**, an esteemed professor at the Department of Physics and Astrophysics, University of Delhi. He is internationally acclaimed for his contributions to particle physics and has been honoured with the **Scientific Associateship** by the European Centre for Nuclear Research (CERN). Among his accolades, he was also awarded the **INSA Young Scientist Medal** by the Indian National Science Academy in 2011. The talk explored the fundamental nature of atoms, the basic building blocks of matter, and their subatomic components: protons, neutrons, and electrons. Dr. Naimuddin explained how quarks, which make up protons and neutrons, are currently regarded as the smallest known particles in the universe. He also discussed how particle physics research is conducted in various accelerators, such as SLAC, Fermilab and CERN.

The session concluded with an engaging Q&A segment, where students posed thought-provoking questions related to Dark Energy, Big bang and God Particle etc.

These discussions showcased the students' enthusiasm and curiosity, leaving them inspired by the profound complexities of atomic science. The Department of Physics takes immense pride in organizing intellectually enriching events that foster curiosity and ignite a passion for exploration among aspiring physicists.

## Introduction to Quantum Computing with Superconducting Circuits

In celebration of the United Nations' declaration of 2025 as the *International Year of Quantum Science and Technology (IYQ)*, Sparks-The Physics Society and the Department of Physics at Sri Guru Tegh Bahadur Khalsa College organized a talk titled *Introduction to Quantum Computing with Superconducting Circuits* on 9 January 2025, also marking the 82nd birth year of renowned physicist Dr. Stephen Hawking.

The event featured our alumnus from the 2020 batch, Mr. Harsh Bhardwaj, currently a Doctoral Student at RWTH Aachen University, Germany. The session was held in Room G5 at 1:45 PM. The event was attended by 29 students and 5 faculty members, who actively participated in engaging discussions following the talk. He highlighted cutting-edge advancements in quantum computing, particularly the role of superconducting circuits in building scalable quantum systems. Harsh shared his research journey, addressing common myths, challenges, and opportunities in the field of quantum computing, and offered personal insights from his experiences working in a lab environment. He provided attendees with a clearer understanding of the flourishing landscape of quantum computing research and emphasized its wide-ranging potential across industries, from cryptography applications to optimization and simulations.

The session ended with a Q&A segment where Harsh addressed key questions from the audience. These included the sources of errors in quantum systems and methods for correcting them, the distinction between qubits and logical qubits, and why a quantum computer with a larger number of qubits may not always outperform a system with fewer qubits. Additionally, he dispelled common myths surrounding quantum computing research, which further enriched the academic exchange. The event was a huge success, aligning with the global celebrations of IYQ, and encouraged the next generation of physicists and researchers to explore the vast possibilities within the realm of quantum science.



## **Unraveling the Invisible — The Neutrino Story**

On the International Day of Women and Girls in Science i.e. 11th February 2025, **SPARKS**—The Physics Society of Sri Guru Tegh Bahadur Khalsa College, honored the contributions of women physicists who have played a crucial role in unraveling the mysteries of the universe by organizing a talk titled *Unraveling the Invisibles — The Neutrino Story*.

We had the honor of hosting Professor Poonam Mehta, a distinguished UGC Professor in the School of Physical Sciences at Jawaharlal Nehru University (JNU) in New Delhi. Professor Mehta has received several accolades, including the Bharat Vikas Award in Bhubaneswar (2017) and Science Merit Awards from Delhi University (1995 and 1997). She has also completed fellowships at CERN in the USA, DESY in Germany, DAAD Research Stay, and CSIR.

The session, which took place in Room G5 at 12:30 p.m., was attended by 26 students and 5 faculty members, who actively engaged in discussions following the lecture. Prof. Mehta highlighted key topics such as the Nobel Prize awarded for the proof of neutrinos' existence, neutrinos from natural resources, and the discovery of neutrino oscillations. She also pointed out the significant **Indian connection** to neutrinos, as they were first discovered in the Kolar Gold Fields (KGF) in 1965.

The session concluded with a Q&A segment during which Prof. Mehta addressed key questions from the audience. These included methods used by scientists to detect neutrinos and the relationship between general relativity, particle physics, astrophysics, and neutrino physics. The event was a tremendous success, aligning with global celebrations of International Women's Day and encouraging the next generation of physicists and researchers to explore the vast possibilities in neutrino physics.

To further support plastic waste management, the committee has installed a plastic waste collection bin made from recycled plastic and placed benches made from recycled plastic on the college campus.

The committee has organized various awareness activities, such as a poster-making competition on waste management. To ensure responsible recycling of paper waste generated in different departments, a partnership has been established with Jagruti NGO. The collected paper waste is sent for recycling, and in return, the college receives A4-size recycled paper for academic use. Waste audits have been facilitated in the college, conducted by officials from the Municipal Corporation of Delhi (MCD). Recently, the committee organized an awareness lecture on waste segregation in partnership with MCD, educating cleanliness workers and students on the significance of waste segregation, its implementation, and its environmental benefits.

The visit concluded with a discussion followed by an interactive session on reinforcing the significance of Gandhian values in contemporary society.

The annual event of the society, held on 19th February, revolved around the theme "Relevance of Tolerance and Coexistence in the Contemporary World." The speaker session featured thought-provoking discussions by distinguished scholars, including Prof. Narendra Kumar Centre for Political Studies, Jawaharlal Nehru University, New Delhi and Prof. K.P. The Students' Welfare Committee, driven by its commitment to academic excellence and inclusivity, has undertaken several initiatives to support students from economically weaker sections and those with disabilities. These efforts aim to ensure that financial constraints do not hinder their educational aspirations. On November 8, 2024, an interview process was conducted to identify and shortlist students in need of financial assistance from a pool of 200 scholarship applicants. Following a thorough evaluation, scholarships worth Rs. 9,17,000/- (Rupees Nine Lakh Seventeen Thousand only) were awarded to 106 deserving students, enabling them to pursue their studies with greater ease.

To further enhance awareness about available financial aid opportunities, the committee organized an online seminar on December 5, 2024, in collaboration with Buddy4Study Foundation. This session provided valuable insights into various scholarship programs, equipping students with the knowledge to explore and apply for financial assistance.



In addition to supporting economically weaker students, the committee also prioritized the needs of students with disabilities. Twelve ANGEL Devices were procured and distributed to ensure better accessibility and learning support. Furthermore, the Help the Blind Foundation (HTBF) awarded scholarships totaling Rs. 2,10,000/- (Rupees Two Lakh Ten Thousand only) to students under the Persons with Disabilities (PWD) category, benefiting 10 first-year students and 11 second-year students in 2025.

Through these initiatives, the Students' Welfare Committee remains steadfast in its mission to foster an inclusive, equitable, and supportive academic environment, empowering students to achieve their full potential. The Student Welfare Committee held its annual award ceremony on May 7, 2024, honoring 43 students who secured second place in their respective courses with a trophy and a certificate. Furthermore, seven students of foreign languages viz. French, Spanish, German, Japanese, Korean and Chinese; were awarded with certificate of appreciation. Additionally, seven students received merit-cum-means scholarships, established by current and retired faculty members, as well as eminent personalities associated with the college.
